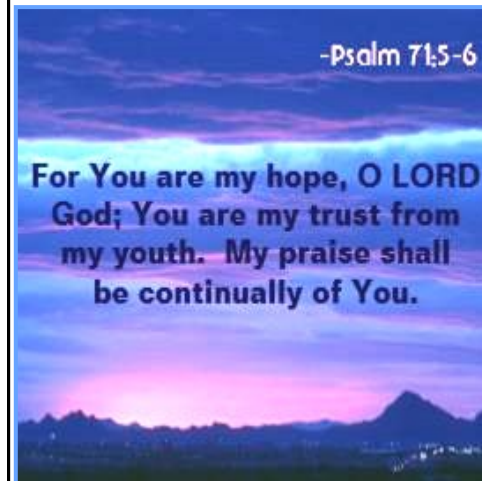

A READING FROM THE LETTER TO THE HEBREWS

CHAPTER 12: BEGINNING AT THE 18TH VERSE:

(Pew Bible page 979)

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death." Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel. See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken - that is, created things - so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire.

THE GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO LUKE

CHAPTER 13: BEGINNING AT THE 10TH VERSE:

(Pew Bible page 848)

Now he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And just then there appeared a woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, "Woman, you are set free from your ailment." When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day." But the Lord answered him and said, "You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the sabbath day?" When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame; and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing.

PRAISE TO YOU LORD JESUS CHRIST

Rev'd Derek Barrett's Commentary on the Readings:

Psalm 71 - You can almost hear the ageing hymn-writer saying, "There's life in the old dog yet!" There is a depth of piety here despite a life of many hardships. The hair is graying and the powers diminishing, but all his life has been devoted to the God who has been good to him and will continue so to the end. He's not just thinking about himself either, for he knows he has a standard to maintain and a lesson or two to pass on to the young and not so young around him who will benefit from what he has to say about the wonderful ways his God has guided and protected him. It is all very reminiscent of the collect, "Lord God, the Protector of all who trust in You, without Whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy, increase and multiply on us Your mercy, that You, being our Ruler and our Guide, we may so pass through things temporal, that we finally lose not the things eternal.....".

Hebrews 12 - There are plenty of references to rocks and The Rock in this morning's psalm, for that big Rock which was the beacon to show the Children of Israel the way to the promised land was both formative and normative in our ancestors' religious memory. Mount Sinai's fearsomeness and the Heavenly City's joyfulness are not to be considered as a moving away from the terror into the safe and the cosy. The Paschal candle, the shepherds' fire and the smoke belching out of the mountain top all have to do with the votive taper scattering its holy light before the faithful, so that when the cockney kid dragged his wee brother into that ancient parish church which Hitler had just destroyed in the midnight bombing, as soon as he saw the aumbry lamp somehow still twinkling in the wreckage, the two boys fell to their knees as one said to the other, "Bow y'r 'ead, Jesus is here!" That church building would have been repaired and fully restored because those who had grown accustomed to it as a place of sanctuary and a place of worship would not do without it, Here we have no abiding city, but we do have the epistle and it is telling us today what he have to look forward to.

Luke 13 - Clergypersons are fairly immune to the taunt that they only work one day a week and ask those who make the claim which day they are referring to, for most of us reckon that Sunday is mostly a relaxed day, anything can come charging into the rest of the week but usually we can devote that one day to either directing or sharing in the Opus Dei. Jesus could feel the heat of the anger of the "ruler of the synagogue" (a layman), but nothing could or would prevent him from working there and then this particular piece of work, Shabbat or not. This is the first time he has met the "daughter of Abraham" who has been locked at a 90 degree angle for eighteen years, and her presence would not have been obvious as only males were upfront. Sabbath rules pale into insignificance and their breaking is neither here nor there when it was necessary that this woman be loosed from her bonds, and Jesus is still making his way to the Holy City and the rules are even stricter there.

Maleny Neighbourhood Centre Pantry

The MNC Emergency Relief program is run on an annual budget of approx. \$11,000. The program assists local vulnerable families and individuals with pantry items, swags, tents, stoves and vouchers such as Telstra and Fuel. The budget is completely subsidised by MNC and is currently not funded through State/Federal or Local government. It is therefore with immense gratitude that MNC accepts donations from organisations and local community groups towards the food items. The Anglican Church and its donations impact our budget in a significant way by cutting down the amount of food pantry items we then have to order each month. Donations last financial year to the Emergency Relief program enables the MNC to use excess funds for other programs.
